New Year's Day Ride.

Like most plans, this one started life as an idea. A work colleague asked me if the club did any rides in the winter. I said it did because we could advertise rides on the club website but then I wondered what sort of fool would lead a ride in the middle of winter.

Ah, that would be me then.

So, when and where? Let's start the year in the way we intend to carry on. Winter rides are a very different animal to summer rides. In the warmer weather twisty fast roads might be favourite. In winter normal A-roads are quite enough of a challenge. So who will come on this ride? Most sensible folk put their bike away for the winter, but there are a few of us who keep an eye out for those dry winter days.

I decided to do a recce. It was a cold crisp day on the Sunday before. The sun is an expected hazard at this time of year – it never gets very high and is often in your eyes around the next bend. I am thankful of my tinted visor (light tint, of course)! My recce took in an early B-road. Although a fairly well-used road it had not been

treated so it was very icy in places. For years I didn't own a car so I am quite used to riding in slippery conditions. I used to sometimes fall off, too, so I will be avoiding this stuff on the day. On the whole the day was going well. I had a nice lunch. The roads were drying out and I felt able to use more of the tyre's profile and was starting to really enjoy myself.

Then I got a puncture and had to wait about 2 hours for recovery. I got a bit cold.

On the day it was well below freezing and foggy. Not ideal but the forecast was for warmer weather south so I was happy to go. Three of us turned out for a pre-ride warm up coffee. Paul and Steve were the other musketeers. It must be said that, although a bit nippy, it was very picturesque across the Mendips towards Shepton. The freezing fog had bejewelled the trees creating an otherworldly wintry landscape. We continued to Blandford on what would normally be described as 'boring' A-roads but in these conditions will be described as 'safe' and 'comfortable'. Paul left us around now because of family commitments. We continued to Wareham a bit more boldly and risked some B-roads as the ice had by now disappeared. We arrived at the Durlston Country Park, Swanage, where they do a rather good homemade soup in the café, which really hit the spot. We decided to return via the Sandbanks Ferry to Poole. Steve took on the role of ride leader for the trip back up to Blandford and up over the top by Compton Abbas airfield and down to Shaftesbury, where we were suddenly back in winter

wonderland, and fog. Oh, we didn't bother with Zigzag Hill. We went our separate ways at Warminster.

I thoroughly enjoyed the day, as I hope my companions did. Thanks for coming.
